What Is Breast Reduction?

A breast reduction surgery or medically known as mammoplasty is not just a personal choice to appear attractive; it is a solution to women struggling with overly large breasts causing then shoulder, back & neck pain or those who are not happy or are self-conscious about the large breasts. Large breasts often appear droopy which could result in lower confidence due to poor physical appearance.

Breast Reduction procedure is done if:

- You have very big breasts
- You have droopy or ptotic breasts
- You experience shoulder and upper back pain due to heavy breasts.
- Your one breast is larger than the other.
- You get deep furrows in the shoulders caused by the strips of the bras
- You get skin alternation isn the sub-mammary area
- You have stretch marks due to heavy breasts
- You are unhappy and self-conscious about the large appearance of your breasts

What Breast Reduction Can / Can't Do

Can

- Reduce the size of your breasts
- Make your breasts equal in size
- Improve the overall contour of your breasts
- Relieve back and neck pain by reducing breast size
- Make you less self-conscious

⊘ Can't

- Go against the natural shape of your breasts
- Remove only fat through liposuction and get results
- Make your breasts look like they did pre-pregnancy

What is the Procedure of Breast Reduction?

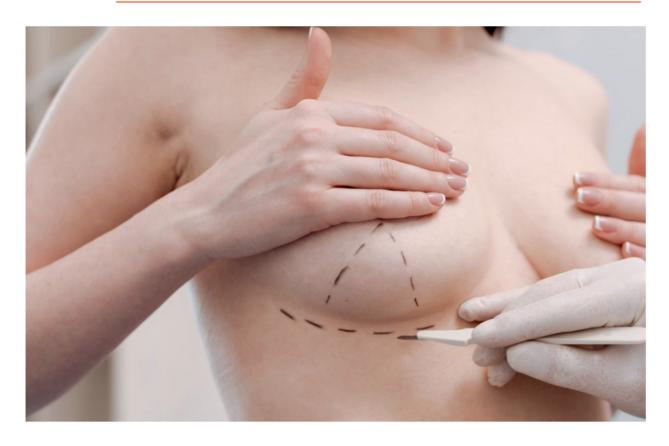
Anaethesia:

The Incision:

- The incision is from areola going inferiorly till short of inferior mammary line

Procedure:

- Liposuction is performed using latest technique of short scar superomedial type
- A special handling and suturing techniques further minimize the scar
- When the intervention is finished, a semi-compressive dressing is placed on the breasts as well as a drain if it is surgically indicated



Recovery After Breast Reduction?

- You may experience small amount of swelling, bruising and discomfort in the first 24 48 hours, but you can do your daily chores and go for a walk if desired
- You can return to work 3 days post surgery if you have a sitting job that doesn't require strenuous activity
- One can start driving 7 days post op, but it always has to be wearing the bra which has to be used during day and night time
- Majority of the patients feel normal, one month post surgery. By then, most of the bruising, discomfort and swelling subside
- By 6-8 weeks, you will be cleared to do all types of physical activity again

- The breasts will still continue to "settle" into their final position over the course of the next few months
- You will be advised to wear a compression garment for 6 weeks
- Please note that each person is different and so is their recovery timeline. The above is only interpreted as a general guideline, rather than a rule
